

**RESOLUTION**

WHEREAS, natural, technological, and man-made hazards can affect the Town of Lumberport:  
and

WHEREAS, significant structural, historical, and economic losses could result from an occurrence of a natural, technological, or man-made hazard events: and

WHEREAS, undertaking mitigation projects during pre-disaster periods could decrease the total losses the Town of Lumberport incurs as a result of said hazard occurrences.

WHEREAS, the Lumberport Town Council has partnered with the Region 6 Planning and Development Council to regionalize the Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan in an effort to further identify, define, and characterize the hazards affecting Town of Lumberport as well as to continue identifying and prioritizing projects that could lessen hazard vulnerability.

WHEREAS, the Lumberport Town Council has a strong interest in reducing losses from future hazard occurrences: and


WHEREAS, the hazard mitigation plan is a federal and state requirement to maintain eligibility for hazard mitigation funding, and by that requirement, must be updated a minimum of every five (5) years: and

WHEREAS, a cooperative effort is an efficient way to plan for and reduce hazard susceptibility in all government jurisdictions in Town of Lumberport, West Virginia.


WHEREAS, the Lumberport Town Council and the communities within Region 6, joined in the completion of this regionalized Hazard Mitigation Plan Update.
