

CHAPTER XII.

OFFENCES AGAINST THE PEACE

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for two or more persons to assemble, except in a place designated for public meeting of the citizens, or at a public sale or place of business, for the purpose of loitering or loafing on any public street, sidewalk, street corner, alley or doorway or steps of any building in any manner that will obstruct the free use of the same by the general public for the purpose of which such was originally constructed.

SECTION 2. When any persons are assembled in or upon street, sidewalk, street corner, alley, doorway or steps of any building, it shall be unlawful for them to conduct themselves in a manner annoying to persons passing by or using said streets, sidewalks, steps or doorway, or in a manner annoying to occupants of any building or buildings adjacent thereto.

SECTION 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to commit, or cause to be committed, or to assist in committing any riot, noise, or disorder, or to disturb the peace and quiet of the town, or to be guilty of any other disorderly conduct.

SECTION 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to throw any stone, brick, stick, or can or other missile in or into any street, alley, or public square or enclosure.

SECTION 5. It shall be unlawful for any person to burn any shavings, leaves, waste paper, rubbish or other matter in any street, alley, or public thoroughfare of the town without first obtaining consent of the Mayor, or Police

Chief or Fire Chief.

SECTION 6. It shall be unlawful for any person to commit an assault or an assault and battery, or to aid or encourage any one in so doing.

SECTION 7. It shall be unlawful for any person to carry about his person any pistol, revolver, knife, razor, lead or brass knuckles, or any other dangerous weapon or devise, but nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent any person from keeping a revolver or pistol about his dwelling house or premises, or from carrying the same from his dwelling house to another place for the purpose of engaging in target practice or shooting matches at that place, nor shall this section be construed to prohibit any officer charged with the execution of the ordinances of this town or the laws of this state from carrying such pistol or revolver or other lawful weapon.

SECTION 8. It shall be unlawful for any person to interrupt or disturb any lawful assemblage, or public meeting for the worship of God, or act in a disorderly manner in or about any church or place of worship.

SECTION 9. It shall be unlawful for any person keeping a hotel, restaurant, barber shop, pool or billiard hall or other public place of the town to suffer upon such premises any rioting, drunkenness, lewdness, obscenity, or other conduct which disturbs the peace and quiet of the town.

SECTION 10. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride or propel a bicycle upon any sidewalk within the Town of Lumberport.

SECTION 11. It shall be unlawful for any person to commit theft or petty larceny within the town.

SECTION 12. It shall be unlawful for any person to loiter about the jail or converse with prisoners therein. Any one violating any of the above provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than FIVE DOLLARS or more than ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS; and may be imprisoned in the town jail for a period of ten days or both fined and imprisoned.

CHAPTER XIII.

OFFENCES AGAINST MORALITY AND DECENCY

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to use or utter lewd or profane language in any public place within the town, or to commit or perpetrate any indecent, unmodest or lewd act, or to make an indecent or immoral exposure of his or her person in any public place within the town.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any persons to assemble in any public place within the town or in any house, office or building within the town for the purpose of prostitution, adultery, lewdness, or indecency. It shall be unlawful for any person to keep within the town any house of ill fame, or bawdy house, or house of resort for prostitution or adultery, or harbor persons therein for any such purpose or purposes.

SECTION 3. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to lewdly and lasciviously associate or cohabit together in the town or to commit any act of open or gross lewdness.

SECTION 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell to another any impure unwholesome or any diseased food, or to sell milk from diseased cows.

Any one violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall upon conviction be fined not less than FIVE DOLLARS or more than ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS, and may be imprisoned for ten days or both fined and imprisoned.

CHAPTER XIV.

GAMING

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, at any place, public or private, to bet or wager money or any other thing of value on any game of chance, or to furnish any money or other thing of value to any other person to bet or wager on any such game.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any one to run or promote a gambling game or game of chance, or to take or offer to take wagers on the outcome of any event of chance, or to solicit any person to take part in or to make a wager on any gambling game or game of chance.

SECTION 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to act as doorkeeper, guard, or watchman, or to employ another person to act as such, for a keeper or exhibitor of any gaming table, gambling game or device, or to resist or by any means prevent, hinder, or delay the lawful arrest of such keeper or exhibitor, or the seizure of the furniture and devices used in such game and the money staked thereat.

SECTION 4. It shall be unlawful for the owner or occupant

roman candles, skyrockets, sparklers or any other thing of like nature or kind commonly known as firearms or fireworks. It is provided however, that the Mayor of the Town of Lumberport may by proclamation suspend the operation of the above section for periods of not more than ten hours at any one time upon occasions of rejoicings and celebrations during which time this section shall not be in effect.

Any one convicted of violation the provisions of this article shall be fined not less than FIVE DOLLARS nor more than FIFTY DOLLARS or be imprisoned not more than ten days, or both.
