

CHAPTER X

SECTION I: DEFINITIONS

The following definitions shall be used to interpret this ordinance:

Person: Shall mean an individual, corporation, partnership, association or any underfined owner or occupant within the Town of Lumberport, which at any time may require the use of the fire department.

Unit: Shall mean any dwelling, rooms, apartment, service station, store, garage, school, rest home, beauty shop, pool room, restaurant or any other underfined structure owned or occupied by an person within the Town of Lumberport, which may require the use of the fire department.

SECTION II: Fees

A monthly service fee of 25¢ shall be charged each person for each unit, as defined in Section I, within the said Town of Lumberport, for the maintenance of said fire department.

SECTION III: MODE OF COLLECTION

The monthly charge of 25¢ shall be posted upon each water or garbage card sent to customers within the said town and shall be paid at the same time as the water or garbage bill.

SECTION IV: PENALTIES

Anyone refusing to pay said fee, or for violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall upon conviction be fined not less than \$1.00 or more than \$5.00, and for a second or subsequent offence shall be fined not less than \$5.00 or more than \$10.00 or be confined in the city jail for not more

than 3 days or both fine and imprisonment.

SECTION V: SEPARABILITY

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrases or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed as separate and independent provision and such holding shall not effect the validity of the remaining portion hereof.

SECTION VI: ORDINANCES REPEALED

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, are hereby repealed.

SECTION VII: EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect on the 1st day of December of 1960.

CHAPTER XI.

OFFENCES AGAINST JUSTICE AND ORDER

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to resist by force or obstruct the Chief of Police or any policeman, detective, or officer of the Town of Lumberport in the lawful execution of any duties of such officer or officers, or in the lawful exercise of any power or authority vested in them by law or ordinance.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to aid or abet any other person in resisting an officer or officers in violation of the preceding section of this article.

SECTION 3. It shall be unlawful for any person who has

been regularly summoned to give evidence before the Mayor of the Town of Lumberport, in any matter in which he has the authority to require such a witness to appear and testify, to refuse or fail to attend, testify, and give evidence as required by law in such proceedings.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to conceal or attempt to conceal any person guilty or charged with being guilty of any offence against the town, to escape from the town or to rescue or assist or attempt to rescue any person in custody of the said town or any officer thereof, to escape from such custody.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any able bodied male persons, between the ages of twenty one years and fifty years of age, being called on by the Chief of Police or other peace officer of said town, to assist in making of an arrest or the suppression of any riot, disorder, tumult, or unlawful act, to refuse or neglect to promptly comply therewith in good faith and to assist in the manner required.

Section 6. It shall be unlawful for the Chief of Police or officer of the Town of Lumberport to neglect or refuse to come into execution any lawful order, writ or requirement within the previews of his office.

Any person guilty of the foregoing sections shall upon conviction be punished by a fine of not less than FIVE DOLLARS nor more than ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS, and may be imprisoned not more than ten days or both fined and imprisoned.
